Final Rules

General Competition Rules.

Fishing will be carried out in the spirit of, and with respect for, the traditions of the sport.

All competitors ((including visiting overseas anglers) must be in possession of a valid Environmental Agency rod licence. It is the Competitors responsibility to ensure they have a licence as they are not available from the fishery. Spot Checks may be made by the Environment Agency.

Any dispute or complaint must be reported to the Events Organiser (Iain Barr) or match officials (tbc on the day) within 30 minutes of the end of the match. Adjudication will be made within 30 minutes of the complaint being made. Any dispute/complaint made after 30 minutes of the end of the match will be deemed invalid. The decision of the match committee is final. The results will be published as soon as possible after the completion of the match.

Mobile telephones may be taken onto the fishery, must be turned off and may only be used for emergency purposes if previously agreed with the Competition organisers, Score cards will be marked as such. Mobile telephones or any other electronic communication device may not be used to communicate with other competitors under any circumstances, either by voice message or text message.

The Sector Controllers are there to ensure that the event is run fairly within the rules, they are totally voluntary and no abuse of any form against the Controllers will be tolerated. Any such abuse, if reported by a Controller, Competitor or Match Official, will result in instant disqualification from the Competition without the right to appeal.

Practice Sessions:- IMPORTANT

Competitors are permitted to practice leading up to the final including Friday 29th March. Anglers may practice on Fri 29th March on Elinor up to 14:00hrs ONLY. This is to allow a small stocking to go in along with tagged fish and also to permit the fishery to 'rest' before the match days.

Match Rules.

The event will be fished from approx 09:00 to 16:40pm with a 45-minute lunch break. Lunch is not provided. There will be 10 sessions of 35 minutes with 5-minute intervals to move to your next peg: Competitors will move in a clockwise direction approximately 10-12 pegs. Timings are subject to minor alterations.

Scoring:

- An angler can catch a maximum of 5 fish per peg. 2 points will be awarded for the 1st fish on every peg and 1 point thereafter for the next 4. A maximum of 6 points per peg. Each fish must be witnessed and signed for by a match official before leaving your peg. Fish not recorded before leaving your peg will not count and it is the angler's responsibility to ensure all fish are recorded.

- A fish is considered caught when it is successfully netted and lifted clear of the water. All fish must be released from the net and not dragged up the bank

- Anyone not fully respecting the fish may have it removed from their scorecard

- If scores are level to determine the winning positions, the angler who caught on most pegs will win. If still a tie then the angler who caught most fish will win. If still a tie, positions will be decided by working back from the last peg to the first on who caught the most from their last pegs working forward. If by chance still identical then positions will be decided by the angler with the most '5' fish peg limits, then most '4' fish caught and so on. If a decision cannot be made then a draw of lots will take place to decide the winners

The Pairs scoring will be the combined total of the pairs fish points. (Angler A scores 2 off each peg, Angler B scores 3 off each peg therefore they have a combined score of 50 points off 10 pegs. It is this combined score that will determine the pairs results. If the combined points are level, a combined number of pegs caught on will decide the winners, if still level, a combined number of fish caught will decide the winners, if still tied, the number of fish caught on the countback from the last peg working forward will determine the winners. If by chance still identical then positions will be decided by the angler with the most '5' fish peg limits, then most '4' fish caught and so on. If a decision cannot be made then a draw of lots will take place to decide the winners

The draw will be done at approx. 14:30 at Elinor Fishing Lodge Anglers present are welcome to do their own draw. Where anglers are not present the draw will be done with witnesses on their behalf. Anglers may walk round Elinor to view their pegs after the draw is done

Sign-in will be from 07:00 at the lodge and a mandatory briefing for ALL competitors will be held at 08:15 in front of the Lodge area. Competitors may leave from this area at approx. 08:30.

Each competitor will receive a separate score card for the morning and afternoon sessions. Each individual competitor must hand in their scorecard to the match officials or controllers at the end of each session promptly. The afternoon score card must also be handed in to the match officials within 20 minutes of the end of the match. Any scorecards received after this time cannot be accepted.

Non-Competitors/Spectators are not allowed in the fishing area during the hours of the Competition. The Fishing area is defined as the Bank and the area 25 metres behind it. The exception to this rule is media or TV crew and match officials.

Competitors may not receive assistance from another Competitor, Controller, Official or any other person apart from safety assistance. Competitors must fish directly in front of their and not move either side of it.

No competitor can leave their peg before the end of their session – a 5-point penalty will be applied in this case.

Flies

There is no limit to fly dressing or hook size. **Barbless or de-barbed** hooks must be used throughout the day. Snakes are permitted but may contain only one hook point. No doubles or trebles.

THE USE OF ANY BUOYANT FLIES ON ANY SINKING LINE IS PROHIBITED IN THE INTEREST OF THE WELL BEING OF THE FISH. SINK TIPS CLASS AS SINKING LINES AND NO BUOYANT FLIES CAN BE USED ON THEM

Sight Indicators / Bungs of any description are allowed but must be capable of catching a fish, i.e. must contain a hook. They must be in a fixed position to your leader and not sliding.

A maximum of 4 flies may be used at any time on any one rod and a bung counts as 1 of your flies

The Penalty for breaking the hook rule:

Barbed hook - Immediate Disqualification of all points up to and including the current peg to a First Offence - minimum of -5 points.

Second Offence - Disqualification from Event with no right of appeal

Please note this rule will be stringently enforced and cotton will be used to test hooks

PLEASE NOTE. If your hook is considered barbed in any form, the controller has the right to confiscate your fly which will be presented to the match officials whose decision is final. You may continue to fish and a decision will be informed at the end of the morning or afternoon session. Match officials may request to view fly boxes at any time.

Additives

All flies must be placed in a fly box and not kept in bags. No flies may be 'dipped' in additives. Flies can be tested for such additives at any time during the competition by way of a simple test. Any angler caught using flies with additives will be immediately disqualified and may not continue to fish.

Rods Nets & Lines.

Competitors may carry any number of any rods of any length at any time. Competitors may only use one Rod one at a time, roly-poly retrieve is allowed. Competitors are responsible for providing their own knotless mesh landing nets. Only manufactured fly lines may be used. Homemade shooting heads are not permitted

Fishing.

All fish are to be returned very carefully to the water after confirmation of capture by the sector controller. Any dead or damaged fish that cannot be returned to the water are to be surrendered to the Sector Controller.

It is the Competitors responsibility to ensure the fish is recorded correctly by the Controller. The Fish must be lifted from the water in the net by the Competitor and the Controller must acknowledge the capture if he/she is unable to get to the Competitor. The Controller must not help in the landing of a Fish and fishing must not recommence until the fish has been safely returned to the water. **No fish will be recorded unless confirmed by the Controller as having been seen in the net and identified as a Brown/Rainbow Trout. If the Controller is too far away then the confirmation of a neighbouring Angler will be required.**

Tagged fish must be returned where possible. Simply remove the tag from the fish and hand to the nearest controller when the fish is released. Prizes cannot be claimed without the tags. Any tagged fish caught in the morning sessions must be handed in at the lunchtime interval.

If a fish is hooked BEFORE the end of the session is sounded, the Competitor must land it before the next session starts, if the fish is not landed before the commencement of the next session it will be disqualified. The Competitor must vacate the peg before the start of the next session.

Fishing after session end hooter.

Disqualification of any points accrued after the Hooter and any session points for that session

Foul hooked fish are permitted but any competitor deemed to be attempting this deliberately will be immediately disqualified.

Wading

Wading will be permitted at a depth likely to be thigh depth. This may change if water levels are high and murky water as it may be deemed dangerous in places.

Cancellation

If the Final is prematurely ended then point scores will take place at the point of cancellation.

Horn Signals

The commencement of each session will be signalled by a long continuous horn blast.

The cessation of each session will be signalled by 2 continuous blasts.

If fishing is to be stopped at any other time due to an emergency (e.g. Thunderstorm) this will be signalled by 4 blasts of the horn. Fishing will not commence until another 4 blasts has been sounded. If a session ends between these signals then the normal end of session and commencement of session signals will be made and the Competitors should move carefully to their next peg and await the 4-blast signal. No Competitor is permitted to fish until the 4-blast recommencement signal is made.

The end of the competition will be signalled by a continuous horn blast.

If a horn is accidentally set off then it will be followed by 3 short blasts to instruct the Anglers to ignore the accidental blast!

Prizes

Individual – The prize fund will be confirmed nearer the time. If 90 anglers are confirmed the prize fund will be £4500.

The prize fund will be dependent on the number of entries and all entry fees will go to the prize fund.

If full, the individual winner will receive £2000, 44.4% of the cash pot.

2nd place 22.22% i.e. £1100, 3rd place 11.11% i.e. £500, 4th place 7.7%, i.e. £350, 5th place 5.5% i.e. £250.00; 6th place £120 7th place £100, 8th place £70. 9th place £60, 10th place £50

Pairs – The prize fund if full for the pairs will be £2700 - 45 pairs

The winning pair will receive 44.4 % of the prize fund i.e. £1188

The prize fund will be for the top 5 pairs. Full amounts will be confirmed once comp is closed and number of entries confirmed.

Tagged Fish

There will be many tagged fish to be caught on the day worth cash and great tackle prizes worth thousands of pounds. No prize can be claimed without the tag. This will be made clear on match morning. Any tagged fish not caught on the singles day will be carried over to the pair's day. Any not caught over the weekend will still be given away and names drawn at random. You cannot win more than 1 tagged fish prize by the random draw but can if you catch more than one tagged fish. If you are not there on the pairs day the prize will be posted to you. If you enter the singles and pairs your name will be entered twice.

Cancellation

In the unlikely event insufficient entries are received, the event may be cancelled and all entry and permit monies paid will be returned. **(Sufficient entries have been received for both dates of the competition)** By entering, you agree the event organiser and venue cannot hold any responsibility for any other cancellation fees incurred by the entrant.

Rule modification

Minor rule modifications may occur so please review our website for the latest rules. A full set of rules will be available at the lodge at ELINOR leading to the event and will be reiterated on match mornings. The event organisers decision will be final on any rules.
